**Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan:** Al Lavan (Colorado State, '68) is in his seventh season as head coach of the Hornets. He holds a 38-29 overall record (.567), including a 32-15 mark (.681) vs. MEAC opponents at DSU. Lavan is third on the Delaware State career list for football coaching victories. He is 4-1 vs. Florida A&M. Delaware State is 20-11 overall (.645), including 16-6 in MEAC games (.727), at Alumni Stadium during the Lavan era.

**Florida A&M Head Coach Joe Taylor:** Taylor (Western Illinois, '72) is in his third season as head coach of the Rattlers. He owns a 17-7 record at Florida A&M. Now in his 28th year as a college head coach, Taylor has a career record of 214-83-4. He is 12-3 all-time vs. Delaware State, including 1-1 with Florida A&M.

**THE GAME**

Delaware State welcomes Florida A&M to Alumni Stadium in the 2010 home opener for the Hornets. The contest also marks the kickoff of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference season for each team. The Hornets are trying to rebound from a 37-27 opening day loss to Southern University in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge in Orlando, Fla., last Sunday. DSU led 27-16 before the Jaguars scored 21 unanswered points in the final 7:59 of the game. The Southern win overshadowed a career performance by Delaware State's Larrone Moore, who collected 186 all-purpose yards. Moore also became the first Hornet with two touchdowns of 85-or-more yards in a game. DSU's Andre Carroll led all players with a career-high 13 tackles in the contest.

Florida A&M opened the season on Thursday, Sep. 2 with a 45-0 loss to major college No. 13 Miami (Fla.). The Rattlers were outgained 405-110 in the contest. Running back Lavante Page was a bright spot for Florida A&M, averaging 8.8 yards on four carries (35 total rushing yards). Fellow back Phillip Sylvester, a preseason All-MEAC First Team selection, led the Rattlers with 45 rushing yards on 15 carries. Cornerback Curtis Holcomb had eight tackles (7 solo), while Qier Hall had eight tackles and an interception (24- yard return) for Florida A&M. The Rattlers were picked to finish second in the 2010 MEAC race after posting an 8-3 overall record and 6-2 mark in the league last season.

**THE SERIES**

This is the 28th meeting between the teams since the series began in 1977. Florida A&M holds a 19-8 lead in the series. The Rattlers won last year's meeting 21-12 in Tallahassee, Fla., to snap a four-game Delaware State win streak in the series. In the 2009 meeting, quarterback Curtis Pulley rushed for 196 yards and a touchdown, and passed for 140 yards to lead the Rattlers. The Hornets won the last contest between the teams at Alumni Stadium, 35-28, in overtime in 2008. This is just Florida A&M's second visit to Dover since 2002.

## SCOUTING FLORIDA A&M



Florida A&M returned more than 60 letterwinners from its 2009 team, which posted an 8-3 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the MEAC. The Rattlers were picked to finish second behind front-runner South Carolina State in the 2010

MEAC race.

The biggest issue entering the season for the Rattlers was finding a replacement for quarterback Curtis Pulley, who passed for more than 1800 yards and 12 touchdowns and rushed for nearly 900 yards and six scores in 2009. Redshirt sophomore quarterback Martin Ukpai played the entire game in the Rattlers 45-0 loss to Miami (Fla.) in the season opener. He completed 5-of-11 passes for 58 yards, with one interception vs. Miami.

Senior Phillip Sylvester led the Rattlers with 45 yards rushing on 15 carries in the opener at Miami. The 2010 preseason All-MEAC First Team selection rushed for 525 yards and seven touchdowns last season. He was named MEAC Rookie-of-the-Year after rushing for nearly 900 yards as a freshman in 2007.

Halfback Lavante Page (r-so.) averaged 8.8 yards on four carries (35 rush yards) in the opener at Miami.

Kevin Elliot (r-jr.) and Isaac West (sr.) are the top returning receivers. Elliot had 44 catches for 554 yards and seven touchdowns, while West, a preseason All-MEAC First Team selection, hauled in 36 passes for 641 yards and two scores in 2009. On defense, right cornerback Qier Hall (sr.) is a preseason All-MEAC First Team pick. Last season, he had 42 tackles, three interceptions and 15 passes defended. Inside linebacker Alvis Graham (r-jr.) is Florida A&M's top returning tackler. Last season, he had 69 total tackles (39 solo) and a sack. Strong safety Greg Harvey (r-jr.) recorded 46 tackles (28 solo) in 2009. Florida A&M placekicker Trevor Scott was 12-for-22 on field goal attempts (long 51) last season.

Prior to accepting the Florida A&M post, Joe Taylor led Hampton to five MEAC titles as head coach at Hampton University. Five members of his FAMU coaching staff have ties to Hampton University.

## MOORE SHINES IN SEASON DEBUT

Delaware State's Larrone Moore is off to a flying start to the 2010 season. The senior receiver/kickoff returner had two receptions for 92 yards, including a career-best 85-yard touchdown, and two kickoff returns for 94 yards, including a 90-yard touchdown.

Moore was tops in the MEAC in kickoff return average (47.0) and all-purpose yards (186.0) after the opening weekend games. He also had the longest kickoff return (90 yards) and reception (85) in the conference last week.

Moore ranks second in the MEAC with 92 receiving yards (92.0 ypg) after the opening week.

The 85-yard reception was the longest of Moore's career, and the 90-yard kickoff return tied for the longest of his career. He also returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdowns vs. SC State in 2009. The touchdown catch was also the second of his career.

Moore now has 2,058 career all-purpose yards at Delaware State (1,116 KOR; 878 receiving; 64 rushing). Phil Anderson is the Hornets' career leader with 4,317 all-purpose yards. Grayland King is 10th with 2,574.

He needs 122 receiving yards to reach 1,000 for his collegiate career.

## OPENING-GAME SUPERLATIVES

In addition to Moore, several other Hornets recorded milestones during Saturday's opener against Southern. Back-up QB Nick Elko fired his first career touchdown pass, a 38-yarder to Justin Wilson, who also scored his first collegiate TD.

Elko also scored his first points at DSU, running for two points after his scoring pass to Wilson.

Starting quarterback Anthony Glaud threw the pass that ended with Moore's 85-yard touchdown. It was the longest pass completion of Glaud's career, whose previous best was 59 yards to Eddie Brown in 2008. He also tied his career high with two touchdown passes vs. Southern.

On defense, lineman Andre Carol set a career-high with 13 tackles. His previous best was 11 vs. Morgan State in 2009. In addition, linebacker Quentin Ferguson had a personal best with 10 tackles, while fellow linebacker Kevin Green topped his previous best with nine tackles.

Defensive backs Jomah Watson (6), Matt Spicer (6) and Matt Scott (5) also set personal highs for tackles in last week's opener.

## MEAC TIME

Delaware State, a charter member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), begins its 40th season of league play on Saturday. The Hornets have an all-time record of 116-128-1 in MEAC contests. Delaware State has won or shared six MEAC championships. The Hornets claimed outright MEAC titles in 1985, 1989 and 2007, while sharing the crown in 1987, 1988 and 1991.

Since Al Lavan became head coach in 2004, DSU is 32-15 in MEAC contests (.681), including 16-6 at Alumni Stadium.

Last season, Delaware State was 3-5 in the MEAC, tying for fifth place in the final league standings. The 2009 league mark included a forfeit loss to North Carolina A&T.

The Hornets are 5-1 in MEAC openers under Lavan, who suffered his first league opening loss to Florida A&M (12-21) last season.

## HOME COOKING

The Hornets were 2-2 at home in 2009 to improve to 85-65 all-time at Alumni Stadium. Since Lavan became head coach, Delaware State is 20-11 at home (.645). The Hornets were 5-0 at Alumni Stadium in 2005 and 2007. Lavan is 4-2 in home openers.

## UNDER THE LIGHTS

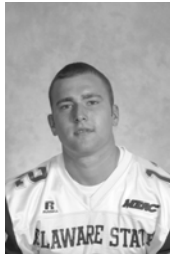
Saturday's game will be Delaware State's ninth under the lights at Alumni Stadium. The Hornets are 5-3 in their previous Alumni Stadium night game since lights were installed in 2006. DSU, however, has lost its last two home night games (2008 vs. Central Connecticut; 2009 vs. Bethune-Cookman). This will be the second time that the Hornets and Rattlers have played under the lights at Alumni Stadium. The teams opened the 2008 season on Thur., Sep. 4 in a nationally-televised night game (ESPNU) in over.

## 2,000 and COUNTING FOR GLAUD



Anthony Glaud's 198 passing yards in last week's loss to Southern pushed him past the 2,000 mark for his Delaware State career. Glaud now has 2,015 passing yards since joining the Hornets in the 2008 season. Before enrolling at DSU, he threw for 266 yards in one season at Bowling Green. Glaud also tied his Delaware State high with two TD passes in last week's opener. The Sicklerville, N.J., native has completed 181 of 312 passes (.580) as a Hornet. He has thrown nine touchdowns and 11 interceptions in a DSU uniform. Glaud has also rushed for five touchdowns at Delaware State.

## ELKO AT THE READY



Delaware State's second-string quarterback inspired confidence after his performance in last week's opener. Redshirt sophomore Nick Elko, filling in after Glaud left the game with cramps, completed two of four passes for 45 yards, including his first career touchdown, a 38-yard strike to Justin Wilson. Elko, who shook off an interception shortly after entering the game, also rushed for a two-point conversion after his touchdown pass to Wilson. The Odenton, Md., has two career starts at Delaware State, including the Hornets' Oct. 17, 2009 contest at Michigan in front of some 106,000 fans. Elko was 18-for-34 for 151 yards in the Michigan contest, including a 42-yard connection with Wilson.

## DELAWARE STATE SELECTS 2010 CAPTAINS

Delaware State heads coach Al Lavan has announced that quarterback **Anthony Glaud**, offensive lineman **Darryl Hicks**, wide receiver/kick returner **Larrone Moore**, defensive tackle **Andre Caroll** and cornerback **Francis Adjei** will serve as team captains for the 2010 season. Glaud (sr.) is in his third year with the team, and second as starting quarterback. Hicks (sr.) is in his second year as a Hornet after two years at Hudson Valley Community College (N.Y.). Moore (sr.) will also serve as a special teams captain each week, while Caroll and Adjei are fifth-year seniors.

## FOUR HORNETS EARN MEAC PRESEASON HONORS

Senior defensive tackle was the lone Delaware State player on the 2010 preseason All-MEAC First Team. Caroll was tops on the Hornets with 56 total tackles and 7.5 tackles-for-loss last season. He was a 2009 All-MEAC Second Team pick.

DSU Quarterback Anthony Glaud (sr.) and running back Jaashawn Jones (jr.) were named to the preseason All-MEAC Second Team offense. Larrone Moore (sr.) was selected to the second team as the return specialist.

Glaud is in his second year as the Hornets' starting quarterback after transferring from Bowling Green in 2008. He completed 127 of 220 passes (57.7%) for 1,294 yards and five touchdowns last season. He was sixth in the MEAC with a 108.3 passer rating in 2009. Glaud also rushed for five TDs last year.

Jones was tops on the Hornets with 632 yards rushing (5 TDs) last year. He topped the 100-yard mark in four of the last five games in '09.

Moore was 14<sup>th</sup> in the nation with a 25.6 yard kickoff return average in 2009. He had a 90-yard return for a touchdown against South Carolina State and a 52-yard return against Michigan.

## **HORNETS 7TH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL**

Delaware State has been picked to finish seventh in the 2010 MEAC football race, according to a poll of league head coaches and sports information directors.

The Hornets collected 120 total votes in the poll. South Carolina State has been picked to win its third straight MEAC title. The Bulldogs collected 15 of 18 first place votes and 315 total votes. Florida A&M is second in the poll. The Rattlers recorded two first place votes and 268 total votes.

Delaware State was tied with Hampton and North Carolina A&T for sixth place in the MEAC with a 3-5 mark (4-7 overall) in 2009.

## **NEW STAFFERS**

Al Lavan has added two coaches to his staff this season. New offensive line coach **Nick Calcutta** rejoined the Hornets last February after serving as the offensive line/tight ends coach at Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) rival Howard in 2009.

During his first stint at Delaware State, Calcutta served as defensive line/special teams coordinator under former head coach Bill Collick in 1996. His resume also includes ten other colleges, including Memphis State, Southern Illinois, Winston-Salem State, South Carolina State and Tennessee State.

DSU's new inside linebackers coach, **John Morgan**, joined the staff this past spring after serving as head football coach at Friendly High School in Fort Washington, Md., where in 2008 he led his team to the 1A/2A/3A County Championship.

In 2007, Morgan was defensive coordinator at North Carolina Central University. Morgan was a defensive intern at the University of Maryland during the 2006 season, which ended with a victory in the Champs Sports Bowl for the Terps.

## **HORNETS TO MAKE SECOND ESPN APPEARANCE**

The Hornets will make their second appearance on the "worldwide leader in sports" family this month. Delaware State's Thursday



Sep. 30 contest against Hampton (previously scheduled for Oct. 2) will be televised live on ESPNU as part of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference's multi-year television agreement with the network.

Delaware State's season opener against Southern last week was televised live on ESPN, the first time the Hornets have appeared on the network.

## **HORNETS REMEMBER HONOR FALLEN HERO**

Delaware State will pay tribute to a former Hornet who lost his life in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks in America.

New York City firefighter Keith Glascoe, a DSU graduate who played for the Hornets in the early 1980s, was among those killed while performing rescue efforts at the World Trade Center that day.

In memory of Glascoe, the Hornets will wear stickers with the initials "KG" on their helmets during Saturday's game.

## **WHAT'S AHEAD**

After an open week, the Hornets will return to action on Sep. 25 at Coastal Carolina. Game time is 6:00 p.m. at Brooks Stadium in Conway, S.C.

Delaware State's home contest against Hampton, previously scheduled for Oct. 2, has been moved to Thur., Sep. 30 at 7:30 p.m. The game will be televised live on ESPNU.

## DELAWARE STATE HEAD COACH AL LAVAN



Al Lavan is in his seventh season as head coach of the Hornets. Since coming to Delaware State in 2004, he has spearheaded a resurgence in the program, highlighted the team's first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship in the 16 years and the school's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2007.

In six seasons at DSU, Lavan has posted an overall record of 38-28 (.576), including a 32-15 mark in MEAC contests (.681). In the three years prior to his arrival, the Hornets were 10-24 overall and 6-17 in league games. Delaware State had just one winning season in the eight years before Lavan took the job. He ranks third on the list for most coaching victories at DSU (38).

Lavan has a 40-29 career record as a head coach, including a 2-1 mark during an interim stint at Eastern Michigan in 2003.

In 2007, Lavan led the Hornets to a school-record 10 wins, their first Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) championship since 1991 and first ever appearance in the NCAA playoffs. In addition, the 2007 Hornets were ranked as high as No. 10 in the weekly Sports-Network Football Championship Subdivision poll and were No. 15 in the final poll. That season, the Hornets became

More than the on-field improvement, Lavan has brought a change of attitude to the program.

In addition to establishing the first comprehensive strength and conditioning program in team history, he spearheaded changes in the team's academic, recruiting, practice and discipline policies. The team is also benefiting from new audio/visual and computer equipment, thanks to a generous donation from prominent alumni spurred by Lavan's outreach efforts to university supporters.

Lavan brought more than 30 years of professional and collegiate coaching experience to Delaware State.

Prior to accepting the Delaware State position, Lavan served two seasons as an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan University. He was promoted to assistant head coach for the 2003 football season, and upon the late-season firing of then-head coach Jeff Woodruff, Lavan was named interim head coach. After he took over the 1-8 team, Eastern Michigan won two of its final three games.

In more than 18 years as a NFL assistant, Lavan's resume' includes stints with the Atlanta Falcons, Dallas Cowboys, San Francisco 49ers, Baltimore Ravens, and the Kansas City Chiefs.

He was a member of George Seifert's 1990 Super Bowl champion San Francisco 49ers' coaching staff. That team included former Delaware State University standout John Taylor, who caught a touchdown pass in the 49ers' 55-10 win over the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXIV.

In Dallas, Lavan worked under Hall of Fame head coach Tom Landry. He helped Cowboy running backs Tony Dorsett and Herschel Walker combine for six 1000-yard seasons.

He helped lead Dallas to division titles in 1981 and '85, and wild card playoff berths in 1980 and '83.

Lavan's collegiate coaching tenure includes stops at Colorado State, Louisville, Iowa State, Georgia Tech, Stanford, and Washington.

After a standout career at Colorado State University, Lavan was selected as a defensive back by the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles in the eighth round of the 1968 draft. He also played two seasons for the Atlanta Falcons before his professional career was cut short by a neck injury.

Delaware State was recognized as the 2007 American Sports Wire Division I Black College National Champions and No. 2 in the final Sheridan Broadcast Network poll of Historically Black College & University teams.

Lavan was honored as the 2007 Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C., MEAC Coach-of-the-Year and Football Championship Subdivision Region II Coach-of-the-Year. He was second in the voting for the 2007 Eddie Robinson Award, recognizing the top Football Championship Subdivision coach, and was awarded the 2008 Making A Difference Award by the DSU Alumni Association.

The Fort Pierce, Fla., native was also selected as head coach for the 2008 American Heritage Bowl/Navy-Marine Corps All-Star Classic in San Clemente, Calif. He guided the Northeast All-Stars to a 24-7 victory in the contest.

The year before Lavan's arrival, the Hornets lost their first nine games en route to a 1-10 overall record.

Southern scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter en route to a 37-27 win over Delaware State before 16,367 sun baked fans at the Florida Citrus Bowl in the 2010 MEAC/SWAC Challenge. The Hornets led 27-16 before the Jaguars stormed back. The Southern win overshadowed a career effort by Delaware State's Larrone Moore, who collected 186 all-purpose yards. Moore also became the first Hornet with two touchdowns of 85-or-more yards in a game. Moore was selected as Delaware State's Most Valuable Player for the contest. Delaware State scored first when quarterback Anthony Glaud connected with Darius Jackson on a 16-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the game. The extra point kick by freshman Mario Diaz-Aviles gave the Hornets a 7-0 lead with 11:08 left in the first quarter. Glaud was 3-for-3 for 33 yards on the seven-play, 3-minute-52 scoring drive. Jaashawn Jones had three carries for 33 yards, including a 24-yard run, during the drive. Moore struck for the first time later in the second quarter to put the Hornets back in front. The Hyattsville, Md., native caught a pass from Glaud on a crossing pattern and sprinted untouched 85 yards for a touchdown to give Delaware State a 13-7 lead with 12:24 left in the second quarter. A poor snap prevented the Hornets from converting the extra point following the touchdown. The touchdown catch was Moore's second at Delaware State, and the longest of his career. It was also Glaud's longest career completion. It took the Hornets just 13 seconds to regain the lead. Moore took the ensuing kickoff and darted down the left sideline 90 yards for a touchdown to give DSU a 19-14 lead with 3:11 left in the second quarter. Another poor snap by the Hornets on the extra point attempt was scooped up by Southern's Anthony Wells, who returned the ball downfield for two points, cutting Delaware State's lead to 19-16.
