National Rankings: Delaware State has received votes (6) in the Fathead SportsNetwork FCS Poll, but not enough to crack the Top 25. The Hornets fell from eighth to ninth in the HSRN poll of Division I HBCU teams, and received 23 votes in the Sheridan Broadcast Network HBCU poll. South Carolina State is ranked 25th in the Fathead SportsNetwork Top 25 Poll and No. 1 in the HSRN and Sheridan Broadcast Network HBCU polls.

Delaware State Head Coach Kermit Blount: Blount (Winston-Salem State, '80) is 2-0 as head coach of the Hornets, defeating VMI (24-21) and Shaw (31-27) in his first two games at DSU. Prior to accepting the DSU post, he was 91-87-3 in 17 years as head coach at Winston-Salem State University. Blount led WSSU to two CIAA championships and three league title game appearances. He was named CIAA Coach-of-the-Year in 1999 & 2000. Blount was 1-6 vs. South Carolina State while coaching at Winston-Salem State.

SC State Head Coach Oliver "Buddy" Pough: Television: Pough (South Carolina State, '75) is in his 10th season as head coach of the Bulldogs. Pough has a 77-31 record at SC State and in his career as a head coach. He has led the Bulldogs to two outright MEAC Championships (2008, '09), a share of the league title (2010) and three consecutive appearances in the NCAA FCS playoffs. He 2009 team was selected as Sheridan Broadcast Network Black College National Championship. Pough is 6-3 vs. Delaware State, including 3-1 at Dawson Bulldog Stadium.

THE GAME

Delaware State kicks off its 2011 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) schedule with a visit to perennial league power South Carolina State. The Hornets, 2-1 overall, are trying to bounce back from a 45-0 loss to FCS No. 7 Delaware in the third meeting between the state's two Division I teams. DSU was held to just 112 total yards, while being shutout for the first time since 2004, a string of 72 games. South Carolina State, ranked 25th in the latest FCS Top 25 poll, is 1-2 overall and 1-0 in the MEAC. The Bulldogs are coming off a 38-21 loss to FBS Indiana last week. SC State kicked off its MEAC schedule with a 26-18 win over Bethune-Cookman on Sep. 10. South Carolina State has won or shared each of the last three MEAC titles.

THE SERIES

This will be the 41st contest between the teams, who first met when the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference was established in 1971. South Carolina State has won the last three meetings to open a 25-15 lead in the series. The Bulldogs won last year's contest 38-21 at Delaware State's Alumni Stadium. South Carolina State scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams in the win. SC State racked up 464 total yards, including 253 on the ground. Redshirt sophomore Chris Merrill rushed for a career-high 160 yards and two touchdowns in his first start. Quarterback Malcolm Long completed 18-of-33 passes for 200 yards. He threw one touchdown and one interception. Delaware State had 325 total yards, including 282 through the air. Quarterback Anthony Glaud connected on 19-of-30 passes for 169 yards. He had one touchdown pass, but was intercepted twice. Linebacker David Erby returned a Glaud interception for a touchdown to give the Bulldogs a second quarter lead. Nick Elko came off the bench to complete 7-of-12 passes for 113 yards and a touchdown for the Hornets. Justin Wilson had nine catches for 131 yards, each a career high and tops for a DSU receiver in a game at the time last season. Delaware State's last win in the series was in 2007 (17-16 at SC State). The Bulldogs won the last meeting between the teams at Dawson Stadium, 52-10, in 2009.

SCOUTING SC STATE



South Carolina State shared the 2010 MEAC title with Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M after winning the crown outright the two previous seasons. The Bulldogs have competed in the NCAA FCS playoffs in each of the last three years. SC State is currently ranked 25th in the latest Fathead SportsNetwork FCS poll, and No. 1 in the two major Black College polls. Each of SC State's losses this season have come at the hands of FBS opponents (Central Michigan, Indiana).

South Carolina State is averaging 17.7 points and 261.7 yards per-game. The Bulldogs are rushing for 125.7 yards and passing for 116 through their first three contests. Starting quarterback **Derrick Wiley** (r-jr.; 6-0/195) ranks in the Top 10 in the MEAC in rushing, pass efficiency and total offense. Wiley is sixth in the league in rushing at 64.0 yards per game (189 total). He's 10th in the conference in pass efficiency, having completed 33-of-73 throws (45.0%) for 335 yards and two touchdowns. He's also thrown two interceptions. In addition, Wiley is seventh in the MEAC in total offense at 174.7 yards per game.

Split end **Tyler McDonald** (so. 6-1/200) is tops on the team with 17 receptions for 244 yards to rank third in the MEAC in each category. He also has a team-high two touchdown catches.

On the offensive line, right tackle **Juavahr Nathan** (r-sr.; 6-3/310) is a pre-season All-MEAC selection.

On defense, SC State is allowing 26.7 points and 403.3 yards per game. The Bulldogs have been pretty tough in the red zone, allowing just five scores (4 TDs) in five chances.

Strong safety **Christian Thompson** (sr.; 6-2/210), ILB **Donovan Richards** (r-sr.; 6-1/215) and OLB **Joe Thomas** (so.; 6-0/230) share the team lead with 31 tackles each, tying for fourth in the MEAC.

Left end **Pat Washington** (r-sr.; 5-10/250) is a preseason All-MEAC pick.

Darius Drummond (so.; 5-11/175) leads the MEAC, and is tied for fourth in FCS, with an 18.4 yard average.

Preseason All-MEAC placekicker **Blake Erickson** (sr.; 5-10/165) also handles punting duties

WILSON QUESTIONABLE MARK FOR SC STATE CONTEST



It's uncertain whether Delaware State wide receiver **Justin Wilson** (jr.; Windsor, Conn.), the 2011 MEAC Preseason Offensive Player-of-the-Year, will be available for Saturday's MEAC opener at SC State. Wilson sat out last week's loss to Delaware due to an ankle injury in the Hornets' win over Shaw on Sep. 10. He had six receptions for 32 yards and a touchdown before being helped off the field after his final catch.

Wilson had six receptions for 110 yards and two touchdowns in the Hornets' 24-21 victory over VMI in the season opener on Sep. 3. He had TD catches of 7 and 47 yards in the contest. His last score put the Hornets ahead 21-14 with 5:46 left in the third quarter.

Counting the final four games of the 2010 season, Wilson has 45 receptions for 711 yards and 10 touchdowns in his last six games.

A 2010 All-MEAC First Team selection, Wilson was the first player to lead the league in receptions (59), receiving yards (937) and TD catches (11) in a season. He ranked 16th among all NCAA-FCS players in receiving yards (85.2 pg) and tied for 35th in receptions (5.4 pg). In addition, he set a Delaware State University record with 59 catches last year. His 937 receiving yards last season ranks third in team history. The junior wideout now has 80 receptions for 1,179 yards and 14 touchdowns with the Hornets.

ELKO RANKS AMONG MEAC'S TOP PASSERS

Despite passing for a season-low 115 yards at Delaware last week, DSU quarterback **Nick Elko** (r-jr.; 6-3/210) still ranks among the MEAC's passing leaders. Through three games, Elko has completed 59-of-103 passes for 585 yards. He has thrown six touchdowns and four interceptions for a 116.5 efficiency rating. Elko completed 17-of-25 passes and was intercepted once in last week's loss to Delaware. He ranks fifth in the MEAC in passing average (195.0 ypg), sixth in total offense (182.7 ypg) and ninth in passing efficiency (116.4 rating).

Elko shook off a shaky first half to complete 25-of-46 passes for 238 yards, each a career-high, in DSU's 31-27 win over Shaw on Sep. 10. He threw three touchdowns for the second straight game, including two in the last 5:10 of the contest. He opened the season by completing 17-of-32 passes for 232 yards and three touchdowns in the Hornets' 24-21 win over VMI on Sep. 3

Elko trained for his starting role with a solid season as the Hornets' No. 2 QB in 2010.

Last season, he competed in 10 games off the bench, completing 39-of-68 passes (57.4%) for 540 yards and seven touchdowns. Elko ranked second in the MEAC in passing efficiency (149.2) and was seventh in passing average (54.0 ypg) during the 2010 season. He threw at least one touchdown pass in six games.

He also showed his versatility by serving as the Hornets' punter in the last six games in 2010, ranking fifth in the MEAC with a 36.8 yard average.

As a redshirt freshman, Elko made his first career start before some 106,000 fans at Michigan. Elko completed 18-of-34 passes for 151 yards in that contest.

Elko signed with the Hornets in 2008 after a celebrated career at Arundel (Md.) High School. He set Maryland single-season records for touchdown passes (43), passing yards (3,091), completions (260) and pass attempts (431) as a senior in 2007.

Although held to just nine yards at Delaware last week, **Jaashawn Jones** (6-1/220; Asbury Park, N.J.) continues to set his sights on the Hornets' all-time rushing leaders. In three games this season, he has a team high 143 yards on 39 carries. Jones has led the Hornets in rushing in each of the last two seasons. Through three games, he is 10th in the MEAC in rushing yards (143) and in rushing yards per game (47.7). Jones was selected to the 2011 Preseason All-MEAC First Team. He now has 1,530 career rushing yards, moving him to within 470 of becoming the ninth player in team history with at least 2,000 yards.

One week after a record performance, DSU wide receiver **Darius Jackson** (sr.; 5-10/185) was held to three receptions for 21 yards against Delaware in the Hornets' last outing. Jackson had career-highs of 127 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winning catch with :35 left, in Delaware State's 31-27 win over Shaw on Sep. 10. His 11 receptions in the contest also tied a school record for the second time. He also had 11 catches in a 2009 contest. Jackson became the seventh player in team history with 100-or-more receptions in the Shaw contest. He's now fifth on the all-time list with 111 catches. Jackson also has 1,229 receiving yards. HORNETS IN MEAC

Delaware State, a charter member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), begins its 41st season of league play on Saturday. The Hornets have an all-time record of 118-134-1 in MEAC contests. Delaware State has won or shared six MEAC championships. The Hornets claimed outright MEAC titles in 1985, 1989 and 2007, while sharing the crown in 1987, 1988 and 1991. Since winning the MEAC title in 2007, Delaware State is 10-14 in league contests, including a 5-7 mark in the road. Last season, Delaware State was 2-6 in the MEAC, eight in the final league standings. The Hornets are 5-2 in their last seven MEAC openers. DSU lost its league opener, 17-14, to Florida A&M at home.

CAPTAINS UP FOR GRABS

Rather than select captains for the season, the Delaware State coaching staff plans to appoint captains for each game this year. "We will name captains for each contest, based on game and practice performance, attitude, classroom and off-the-field activities," said first-year head coach **Kermit Blount**. "This has been my philosophy since I became a head coach."

WILLIAMS IMPRESSIVE IN DEBUT

The injury to Justin Wilson forced the Hornets to activate freshman wideout Milton Williams (fr.; 6-3/195/ Upper Marlboro, Md.) last week. Williams had three catches for a team-high 44 yards in the contest, including a 23-yard grab, DSU's longest play from scrimmage in the game.

MR. "ALL PURPOSE"

Delaware State wide receiver/kick returner **Travis Tarpley** (r-jr.; 5-7/175) is filling up the stat sheet for the Hornets this season. Through three games, Tarpley has 11 receptions for 121 yards and a touchdown (11.0 ypc), 12 kickoff returns for 266 yards (24.3 ypr), four punt returns for 46 yards (13.7 ypr), three rushing attempts and two two-point receptions. He is second in the MEAC in all-purpose yards at 146.7 per game. Tarpley had 174 all-purpose yards in the opener against VMI, 126 vs. Shaw on Sep. 10 and 140 at Delaware last week.



OPENING DAY SUCCESS

Delaware State's 24-21 victory over VMI on Sep. 3 was its fifth opening day win in the last seven years and snapped a two-game losing streak in season openers. Delaware State is 17-14 in season opening games since 1981. First-year DSU head coach Kermit Blount is now 7-11 in opening games as a collegiate head coach. He was 6-11 in season openers in 17 years as head coach at Winston-Salem State.

HOLD THOSE FLAGS

Delaware State is off to a good start in its bid to be the least penalized team in the MEAC for the second straight year. The Hornets are tops in the league in fewest and penalty yards (49.3 pg). Delaware State has been flagged a total of 18 times this season. Despite last week's lopsided score, the Hornets were penalized just five times for 44 yards at Delaware last week. Last season, Delaware State was No. 1 in the MEAC for fewest penalties. The Hornets were flagged a total of 73 times (6.6 pg) for 551 yards, averaging a league-low 50.1 penalty yards per game.

The Delaware State defense has allowed nine touchdowns and two goals in 13 "red zone" chances this season (84.6%).

HORNETS EIGHTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL

Delaware State has been picked to finish eighth in the 2011 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference football race, according to a poll of league head coaches and sports information representatives. The Hornets received 158 total votes in the poll. South Carolina State, which has won or shared the league championship the last three years, has been picked to finish first in the 2011 race. The Bulldogs received 468 total votes and six of 22 first place votes. Bethune-Cookman is a close second in the poll. The Wildcats had the most first place votes, but fell 14 votes shy of SC State (468-454) in the total count. Florida A&M is third in the poll with 420 total votes. The Rattlers collected five first place votes. South Carolina State, Bethune-Cookman and Florida A&M shared the MEAC title with 7-1 league records in 2010. Bethune-Cookman earned the MEAC's automatic bid to the 2010 FCS playoffs on as tie-breaker, while South Carolina State was selected as an at-large entry to the tournament. Delaware State was 2-6 in the MEAC (3-8 overall) during the 2010 season. The Hornets have won or shared six MEAC championships since joining the league in its first year (1971). DSU won outright titles in 1985, '89 and '91, and shared the crown in 1987, '88 and '91.

New Delaware State head coach **Kermit Blount** has mixed some new blood with a few familiar faces for his coaching staff. New coordinators **Arrington Jones** (offense) and **Mike Ketchum** (defense) worked with Blount during his tenure as head coach at Winston-Salem State. Jones, a former member of the NFL's San Francisco 49ers, also served as head coach at Virginia Union University. Ketchum was a head coach at his alma mater, Guilford University.

Blount also added newcomers **Tory Woodbury** (running back), **Bryant Foster** (cornerbacks) and **William King** (safeties) to the staff.

Woodbury was a star quarterback at Winston-Salem State before playing in the NFL for the New York Jets, New Orleans Saints and Buffalo Bills. Foster was a standout defensive back at his alma mater Garner-Webb before serving as an assistant there. King was a Division I-AA All-America linebacker at Marshall University before holding assistant coaching jobs at Concord University (W.V.) and West Virginia State.

Blount also returned familiar faces **Curtis Thomas** (wide receivers/special teams), **Nick Calcutta** (offensive line) and **Jeff Braxton** (defensive line) to his staff.

Thomas, a former star receiver for the Hornets, is in his 12th year on the staff. He has served each of the last three DSU head coaches.

Calcutta, who worked with Kermit Blount at Winston-Salem State, is in his third year at Delaware State.

Braxton is in his third stint at Delaware State. He returned to the Hornets this season after serving the last three years as head coach at Cheyney University (Pa.).

DELAWARE STATE HEAD COACH KERMIT BLOUNT



Delaware State University President Harry L. Williams announced Kermit Blount as the new head coach of the Hornets on Feb. 4, 2011.

Blount brings 27 years of collegiate coaching experience to Delaware State University - including 16 as the head football coach for Winston-Salem State University in North Carolina.

It didn't take long for Blount to earn the respect of the Hornet players and the Delaware State University family. He quickly became an ambassador for the university and the football pro-

gram throughout the region, in addition to establishing new academic, training, practice and accountability policies for the team. Along the way, he found time to attract a top-notch staff of assistant coaches and support personnel to DSU.

Despite just a few weeks to prepare, Blount also directed the Hornets to a successful 2011 spring camp, during which time, new offensive and defensive formations were installed.

DSU President Williams said Coach Blount's record speaks for itself.

"Coach Blount has proven he knows how to guide student-athletes to championship-level seasons as well as accomplish high standards of academic success," Dr. Williams said. "The Search Committee is to be commended for its diligence in reviewing the candidates, in engaging in earnest deliberations and arriving at its recommendation."

Delaware State University Director of athletics Derek Carter says Blount brings a wealth of experience to the Hornet football program.

"Kermit Blount stood out among the many outstanding candidates for the position because of his broad experience, proven leadership and vision for Delaware State University football," Carter said. "His record of leading young men to success on the field and in the classroom makes him an ideal fit for the university and the football program."

Blount expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to lead the Delaware State University football program during his remarks.

"First of all, I want to thank President Williams and the DSU administration, along with the search committee, for the privilege of coaching the Hornets," Blount. "This program has a rich tradition, and the foundation for success is already in place. I'm looking forward to working with the university, our players, supporters and the community to take this team to the next level."

During his tenure at Winston-Salem, Coach Blount had a career record 91-87-3, which included his final 2009 season with the Rams in which he led the team to an 8-2 record. He guided the Rams to two Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) Championships and a total of three CIAA Championship game appearances. He also led Winston-Salem to two Pioneer Bowl appearances, one of which the team emerged as the victor (1999).

Blount is the winningest coach in the history of the Winston-Salem State football program. In fact, he reached the top of the list with a 28-27 come-from-behind win against Delaware State in Dover, Del., in 2008. He has also led the Rams to 25 percent of their conference championships, directing WSSU to two of its eight conference titles as a head coach and to two more conference titles as a quarterback on the team's 1977 and 1978 squads.

Blount was honored as the CIAA Coach of the Year and as the Washington D.C. Pigskin Coach of the Year, as well as the 100% Wrong Club Coach of the Year - each award in both 1999 and 2000.

Throughout his coaching career, Blount has been associated with programs that have experienced phenomenal success. In all, he has been in a leadership role with teams that have won a total of six conference titles at both the NCAA Division I and Division II levels.

Blount began his coaching career in his home state of Virginia at Armstrong Kennedy High School in Richmond as a quarterbacks coach and assistant offensive coordinator. Following two seasons at the high school level Blount moved on to the collegiate ranks in 1983.

In 1983 he became a graduate assistant and assistant quarterbacks coach at East Carolina University where he would begin his collegiate coaching career. Following his stint with the Pirates, Blount joined the staff at Howard University, where he assumed the responsibilities of offensive coordinator from 1984-89 under Bison head coach Willie Jeffries.

Soon after his arrival in the nation's capital, Blount's presence was felt as he directed a potent Bison offense to the 1987 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championship. Following his time at Howard, he spent four more years as part of Jeffries' staff at South Carolina State University (MEAC) in Orangeburg, South Carolina before returning to his alma mater, Winston-Salem State University, as the head football coach in 1993.

During his coaching career, Blount and his coaching staffs have been responsible for recruiting and coaching student-athletes that have earned a total of 106 all-conference selections. In addition, Blount has guided a pair of conference player-of-the-year recipients, one All-America selection and a two-time Academic All-America honoree.

His priority on academics resulted in more than 20 percent of Winston-Salem State University football scholarship student-athletes earning above a 3.0 GPA during the 2007-08 academic year and 22 football players have been named to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Commissioner's All-Academic team over the span of the last two seasons.

During Blount's tenure, the Rams' football team GPA was the highest since the data has been tracked by the WSSU Office of Athletic-Academic Support and Blount and his coaching staff have graduated 79 percent of football student-athletes over the most recent five-year reporting period. Blount helped increase the Winston-Salem players' graduation rate from 42% in 1993 to 80% by 2009.

Throughout Blount's career, a number of his players have risen to play professionally in the NFL, CFL and the Arena Football League, including William Hayes, a third round draft pick and starting defensive end for the NFL's Tennessee Titans.

Not only has Blount helped to shape the futures of former student-athletes at WSSU, he has also helped to guide the careers of countless assistant coaches and coordinators. Blount has helped four of his former assistant coaches move on to successful head coaching careers at the collegiate level.

A 1980 graduate of Winston-Salem State University, Blount enjoyed a fruitful playing career as a Ram. As a four-year starter at quarterback at WSSU, Blount guided the Rams to back-to-back CIAA titles in 1977 and 1978 earning all-conference and All-America honors along the way. The 1978 All-American sat atop the WSSU record books for more than 25 years before his 3,330 career passing yards were surpassed in 2004.

A native of Richmond, Va., Blount has a Bachelor of Science in Health and Physical Education from Winston-Salem State University.

Kermit and wife Ava have two grown children, April and Bryan.

Nick Elko threw for 230 yards and three touchdowns and Justin Wilson had two TD catches to lead Delaware State's 346-yard attack. The Hornet defense forced three turnovers and made a key fourth down stop late in the fourth quarter on VMI's final possession. A Delaware State turnover on the opening kickoff led to a VMI touchdown just 52 seconds into the season. Three plays after Tavis Tarpley lost a fumble on the opening kick at the VMI 11, Chaz Jones scored a touchdown on a one-yard run to give the Keydets a 7-0 lead. The Hornets took advantage of a VMI turnover to score their first points of the season. Tarpley atoned for his miscue by hauling in a 19-yard touchdown pass from Elko on a diving catch to pull DSU to within 7-6 with 12:03 left in the first quarter. The drive began at the VMI 19 following an interception by linebacker Brandon Harvey. The Hornets failed to tie the score when freshman Mitchell Ward missed the extra point kick. The Keydets added to their lead on a touchdown midway through the second quarter. Jones scored for the second time in the game when he fumbled on a three-yard run, but recovered the ball in the endzone to give VMI a 14-6 lead with 6:22 to go before halftime. Elko and Wilson connected on the first of their two touchdown strikes to help pull the Hornets pull even shortly before the half. The duo capped off a five-play, 56-yard drive with a seven-yard scoring pass to pull the Hornets to within 14-12 with 1:55 left in the second quarter. The Hornets tied the score at 14 on a two-point pass from Elko to Tarpley after the touchdown. The teams had to endure a longer than usual halftime break when lightning forced an evacuation of the stadium. Played resumed after a 68-minute delay. Delaware State took the lead for the first time when Elko and Wilson hooked up on a 47-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter. Wilson caught the ball at around the VMI 20, then eluded two would-be tacklers before sprinting into the endzone. Freshman placekicker Mitchell Ward tacked on the extra point to give the Hornets a 21-14 lead with 5:46 left in the third quarter. Wilson had six catches for 110 yards and two touchdowns in the contest. The Hornets stretched their lead to 24-14 when Ward hit his first collegiate field goal, a 24-yard kick with 12:51 left in the fourth quarter. Elko completed 2-of-3 passes for 47 yards during the scoring drive, including a 37-yard strike to Tarpley. VMI pulled to within 24-21 when Jones scored his third touchdown of the game on a 4-yard run with 7:38 left to play. After Delaware State failed to score on its next possession, the Keydets started their final drive of the game at their 20-yard line with 2:51 left to play. The Hornet defense forced VMI into three incomplete passes and a completion for no gain in four plays to seal the win.

Delaware State appeared headed for defeat against Shaw University, but a generous play call by the Bears, a big defensive play and a touchdown pass in a driving rain storm with 35 seconds left resulted in a stunning 31-27 victory for the Hornets in a wild contest at Alumni Stadium Saturday evening. Shaw led by as many as 18 points in the second half before the Hornets stormed back to improve to 2-0. The Bears fell to 0-2. Delaware State trailed 27-24 when freshman Mitchell Ward missed a potential game-tying 33-yard field goal attempt in a downpour with 1:01 left to play, setting off a jubilant celebration along the Shaw sideline. With just one timeout remaining, the Hornets needed a miracle to avoid a home loss to the Division II Bears. After a delay of game penalty against Shaw, the Bears attempted a running play on their next snap. Delaware State defensive end Olusegun Ayanbiola stripped the wet ball from Shaw runningback James Langford, and recovered the fumble at the Bears' 13-yard line with 49 seconds left in the game. Two plays later, Nick Elko connected with wide receiver Darius Jackson on a 13-yard touchdown pass to give the Hornets a 30-27 lead with 35 seconds left. Ward's extra point kick gave DSU a four-point lead. Shaw was hit with a holding penalty, and threw an incomplete pass on its final possession. Jackson had career-highs in receiving yards (127) and touchdown grabs (2), while tying his career mark with 11 receptions, which also ties a team record for catches in a game. Elko shook off a shaky first half to complete 25-of-46 passes for 238 yards, each a career-high. He threw three touchdowns for the second straight game, including two in the last 5:10 of the contest. The redshirt junior was 10-for-18 with three interceptions in the first half. The Hornets outscored the Bears 22-3 in the fourth quarter. DSU's 15-point fourth-quarter deficit was its largest in a victory since overcoming an 18-point hole to defeat Norfolk State 28-21 in overtime to capture the MEAC championship in 2007.

The University of Delaware scored touchdowns on each of its first five possessions and never looked back in a dominating 45-0 win over Delaware State in the third meeting between the state's two Division I teams. The Hens, ranked seventh in the two major Top 25 Football Championship Subdivision polls, won their second straight game to improve to 2-1 on the season, while the Hornets fell to 2-1. Delaware outgained DSU 512-112 to improve to 3-0 in the series between the teams. The Hens took control of the game right from the start. After holding the Hornets to three plays without a first down on the game's first possession, Delaware marched 80 yards for the opening score. The Hens capped off the five-play drive with a 43- yard touchdown pass from Tim Donnelly to tight end Colin Naugle. Sean Banner's extra point kick gave Delaware a 7-0 lead with 11:58 left in the first quarter. The Hornets were held to another three-and-out on their next possession. Delaware responded with a 14-play, 96-yard drive touchdown drive to open up a 14-0 lead. Andrew Pierce scored the first of his three touchdowns on a three-yard run to cap off the more than seven-minute drive with 3:29 left in the first quarter. Pierce had six carries for 38 yards in the drive, which also featured two third-down conversions. Delaware State's next three possessions ended in turnovers, resulting in the 21 points for the Hens. Eight plays after Ricky Tunstall intercepted a Nick Elko pass at the Delaware 42, the Hens added their third touchdown of the game. Donnelly hooked up with Nihja White on an 11-yard scoring pass to give UD a 21-0 lead with 13:56 left in the second quarter. The Hornets recorded their first first-down of the game on their next possession, but the drive was doomed by another miscue early in the second quarter. Three plays after a 15-yard first down pass from Elko to Darius Jackson, Delaware's Jake Guisti scooped up a Jaashawn Jones fumble and returned it 32-yards for a touchdown to give the Hens a 28-0 lead with 11:06 left in the quarter. Delaware State moved the ball into Blue Hen territory for the first time on its next possession, but another turnover ended the march. One play after UD's Paul Worriow scooped up a Josh Bailey fumble, Donnelly connected with White on a 40-yard pass to the DSU one-yard line. Pierce plunged in the endzone on the next play to give the Hens a 35-0 lead with a 7:58 remaining in the first half. Delaware closed out the scoring with 10 points in the third quarter, highlighted by Pierce's third touchdown of the game on a seven-yard run. Elko completed 17-of-25 passes for 115 yards for the Hornets. Travis Tarpley led DSU with four catches, although he collected just 16 yards. Freshman receiver Milton Williams, playing in his first game, had a team-high 44 receiving yards on three catches.
